Title	Coloring Your Wood Project: Tips, Tricks and Techniques
Skill Level:	Beginner, Intermediate, Advanced,
Key Points Covered	Wood selection, wood preparation, wood bleaching, wood sealing, color selection, color blending techniques, project finishing
What Attendees Will Learn	Coloring wood involves a lot more than just wiping dye on the wood. For successful application, the user needs to consider wood grain, wood color, sanding, and sealing prior to color application. The demonstration will explain color selection, color blending techniques, the use of both opaque and transparent colors, and the use of the color wheel. Finally, the demonstration will show users how to obtain a suitable lacquer finish for their colored projects.
